Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between NUML & Tobacco Smoke Free Capital:

Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) was signed between National University of Modern Languages (NUML) and Tobacco Smoke Free Capital Project (Capital Administration & Development Division) Islamabad on January 5, 2017. Brig Riaz Ahmed Gondal, Director General, NUML and Dr. Minhaj us Siraj, Project Director, Tobacco Smoke Free Capital were the signatories.

Tobacco Smoke Free Capital(TSFC) is a project of Capital Administration and Development Divison (CA & DD). CA & DD has been created in wake of the 18th Constitutional Amendment. The Divison is mainly responsible to execute all such functions being previously performed by the devolved Ministries/Divisions within the jurisdiction of the Federal Capital. The principal functions of the Division range from subjects like health, social welfare, education, special education.

About the casestudy:

Introduction:

As universities become more entrepreneurial and look towards technology transfer into non-traditional fields, there is a need for alternative conceptualizations of technology transfer that are more accurate and realistic than the traditional linear model and are adaptable to the nuances of the university to which they are applied.

In order to Fulfill this need NUML ORIC Department has developed a Technology Incubator named "ITCON"working on Technology and Innovation.

ITCON train students for developing prototypes of IT Products such commercial IT projects cater the local market. Currently there are two projects developed by ITCON

Lack of access to health care in Pakistan is a massive, growing problem. The average wait time to see a physician is three weeks. Even if you can see a doctor, it takes 2-3 hours from the time you leave your home or office to the time you get back home. Nearly half of patients with mental health issues go without treatment. Mostly in rural area hundred and thousands of lives can be saved by timely diagnostic of disease or by educating masses about basic health care procedures. Quacks are increasing day by day and so far to control this issue no solution is available to reach patients in rural area and far reached areas. In the article published in medical newspaper stated The government has estimated the presence of more than 600,000 of unqualified doctors all over Pakistan. It is pertinent from the report that the people of Pakistan are not getting the care that they need. There is a high need to design a system assisting patients to reach qualified Doctors on time. The project aims at providing convenient ways to consult doctors online. For consultation services only licensed Physicians would be on board . The solution shall be designed without making any compromise on quality.

For consultation services only licensed Physicians shall be available. The main objectives of the project are to:

- Convert notes and website text in sign language




